- The role will involve regular evening meetings and occasional weekend work

Job description

The job involves working on the BRIC (Building Resilience in Flood Disadvantaged Communities) project which is funded by the European Regional Development Fund. The priority of the project is to build resilience in flood disadvantaged communities. The role we are seeking helps communities to work in partnership with flood risk management agencies to better manage flooding and its impacts in their area. This will involve working with communities at flood risk and agencies using methodologies developed by the National Flood Forum and used successfully around the country.

Personal attributes

We are seeking someone warm and approachable, who will be required to work in Kent and potentially other areas in England & Wales. You will need to be able to engage appropriately and effectively with grass root communities at risk of flooding, as well as professional organisations and be extremely well organised.

Day to day you will work directly with members of the public in communities and liaise closely with external organisations.

Co-workers

The National Flood Forum team is small, intimate and extremely supportive of one another. Officers work in projects across the country but speak and meet on a regular basis. Training and experience is gained alongside these officers in their areas. This may involve extensive travel and overnight stays.

Competencies - Experience and skills required

- You will need to have experience and demonstrate excellent written and verbal communication skills, including the use of IT such as MS office. ArcGIS experience is not essential but would be useful.
- You will need to be highly organised, flexible, able to self-manage and prioritise workloads.
- You will need to have experience of, and demonstrate good management of projects and writing formal reports

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- You will need to have patience, understanding and exceptional listening skills
- You will need to be confident at engaging with all kinds of people over the phone and in person and be able to adapt your behaviour to different situations and people
- You will need to demonstrate excellent partnership working (internally and externally) leading to positive results
